Welcome to Bristol!

On foot
Bristol's central area is well signposted for visitors on foot. Look out for the blue information points dotted throughout the city, which feature detailed street maps to keep you on your way.

By rail
Great Western Railway and other train operators run local, regional and inter-city services from Bristol Temple Meads (C3 on reverse) and Bristol Parkway (M6, off map).

By bus & coach
For Bristol bus routes and timetables visit firstgroup.com/Bristol or download the app. Bristol Bus and Coach station is located in F1 on reverse. Megabus pick-up is located in G1 on reverse.

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By bike

Number Seven Boats (for the Cross Harbour Ferry) and Bristol Ferry Boats (routes shown on reverse) operate regular services around the Floating Harbour. The Bristol Packet (D4 on reverse) runs trips in Bristol and along the River Avon to Bath.

Baltic Wharf A historic marina with water sports, pubs, and views over the harbour.	J8	Clifton Village A myriad of boutiques, restaurants, cafés, and a victorian arcade, close to Brunel's famous bridge.	J8	Old Market An independent and bohemian area, home to a range of LGBTQ+ venues and a vibrant live music scene.	M7	Stapleton Road Find businesses and cuisine from around the world, including world-class samosas, injera, fry ups, and spices.	M7
Broadmead Department stores, banks, high street favourites, and a Victorian shopping arcade.	L7	East Street A neighbourhood high street, with a range of retailers, and occasional markets.	L9	Park Street & The Triangle Home to grand architecture and Bristol Museum & Art Gallery, close to University of Bristol.	K8	Stokes Croft Famed for its street art, an eclectic mix of shops and restaurants, as well as bustling nightlife.	L7
Cheltenham Road Discover a wide range of independent shops, bars and restaurants.	L6	Finzels Reach A vibrant mixed-use area, with hotel, bars, and a street food market every Friday lunchtime.	L8	Sandy Park Road Local high street flanked by independent grocery shops and eateries.	N9	Wapping Wharf A vibrant area with independent cafés, restaurants, and bars – some in converted shipping containers.	L8
Christmas Steps An arts quarter full of unique shops, galleries, food and drink – known for its historic stepped lane.	L7	Gloucester Road Britain's longest independent shopping street close to St. Andrew's Park; a firm Bristol favourite.	L6	St. Marks Road Award winning high street with a culturally diverse range of cafés, shops and restaurants.	M7	Wells Road Local businesses, award-winning cafés, and a warm community feel make this area well worth an explore.	M9
Church Road Lively local high street leading to St. George Park, a leafy victorian park.	N7	North Street A community high street with lots to offer. Also home to an independent theatre and Sunday market.	K9	St. Nicholas Markets A maze of quirky stalls and home to the largest collection of independent retailers and street food stalls in Bristol.	L8	Whiteladies Road An attractive high street, with an assortment of restaurants and bars, hosting a Saturday food market.	K6



See and do

The Harbourside Loop
A leisurely 2.5 mile walk or wheel around the historic harbourside with some of the best views in Bristol. A flat route popular with walkers, joggers and cyclists. There are some stepped areas; alternative routes are shown on the reverse of the map.

Green spaces
The largest parks in the City Centre are **Castle Park, Brandon Hill, Queen Square and The Downs**. Further afield find **Ashton Court Mansion, or Blaise Castle Estate** to explore. **The University of Bristol Botanical Garden** is filled with a range of plants and in the grounds of a remarkable Victorian house.
